## ANESTHETIC ASSESMENT

- » An allergic reaction may occur with any anesthetic used during a procedure. If you suffer from an allergic reaction, you must get in contact with your medic. The allergic reaction can appear through redness, swelling, rash, blisters, dryness, or any other symptoms associated with an allergic reaction.
- » <u>Numbness:</u> We cannot accept responsibility if the area to be treated does not respond to the numbing cream. Each individual is different according to the type of skin. Some clients report that the area is completely numb, while others may feel some discomfort; others may not have any numbness at all. You may request a patch test.
- » Procedure For the micropigmentation procedure, a numbing cream or gel is used. Anesthesia is placed over the treatment area for 20-30 minutes, up to 40, and then carefully removed prior to treatment. As a result of the treatment, combined with the use of the anesthetic, you may experience some redness / swelling that can last for 1 to 4 days. You should always follow the advice after the procedure, to get the best results.

## CONTRAINDICATIONS FOR MICROPIGMENTATION

- » Liver disease high risk of infection
- » Compromised skin on the area of the eyebrows
- » Skin conditions like psoriasis, dermatitis, etc. near the eyebrow area
- » Pregnancy
- » Chemotherapy / Radiation
- » The following medical conditions require a consent note from your Doctor:
  - o Diabetes type 1 y 2, high blood pressure, autoimmune disease, thyroid / Graves' disease.
  - o Any other medical condition that causes a slow recovery or high risk of infection.
